

## WSE International Status

The presence of the WSE in numerous international organisations serves as a confirmation of the high quality of both the organisational and legal standards applied by the Exchange.

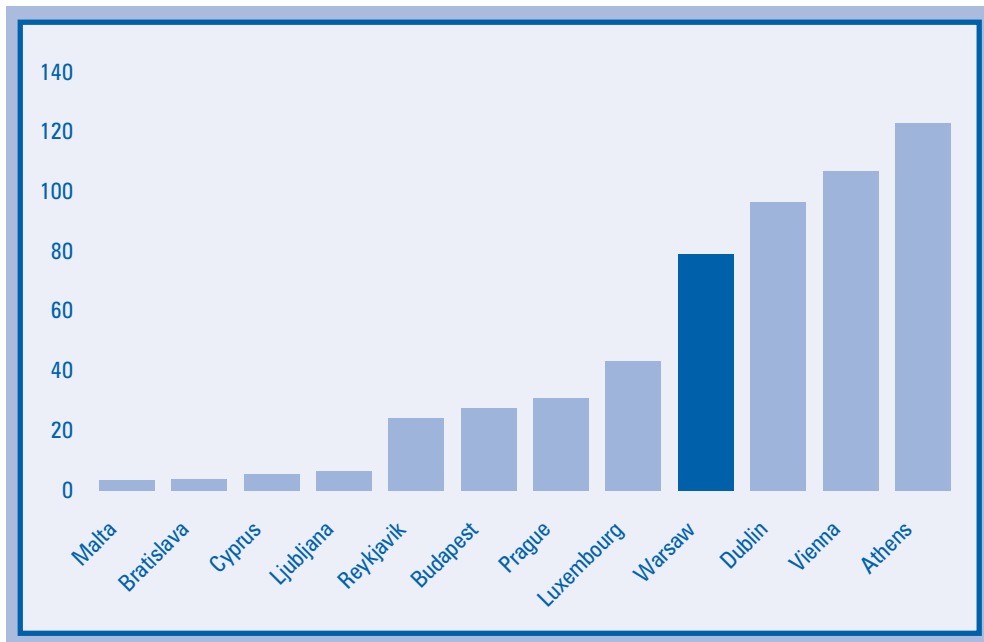
Since October 1994, the Exchange has been a full member of the World Federation of Exchanges, formerly FIBV, an organisation bringing together the most important exchanges worldwide. Within this organisation, the WSE cooperates with exchanges from other countries in the implementation and unification of standards.

As the first exchange in Central and Eastern Europe, in May 1997 the Warsaw Stock Exchange was granted designated offshore

securities market status by the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. This status confirms the position of WSE as a well-regulated capital market meeting standards recognized in the US.

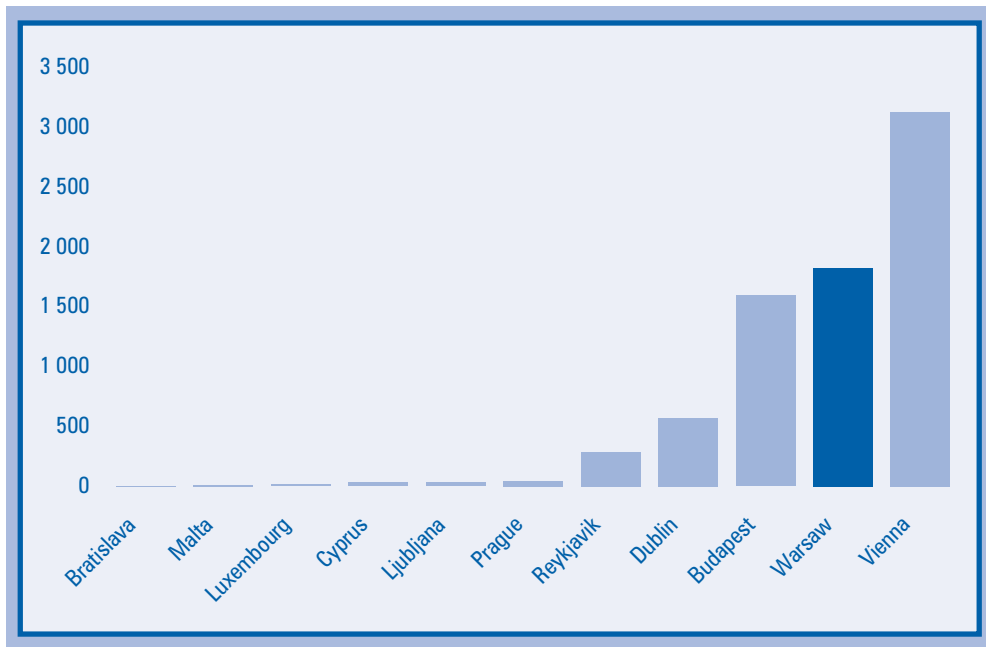
Since 1992, the Exchange has been cooperating with the Federation of European Securities Exchanges (FESE). In June 1999 it became an associate member of the Federation, gaining full membership in June 2004. Since its establishment in 1991, with each year the Exchange has strengthened its position among the European exchanges. Today, the WSE ranks as a mid-sized European exchange and is one of the two largest in Central and Eastern Europe.

### Capitalisation (domestic companies) – December 2005 (billion EUR)



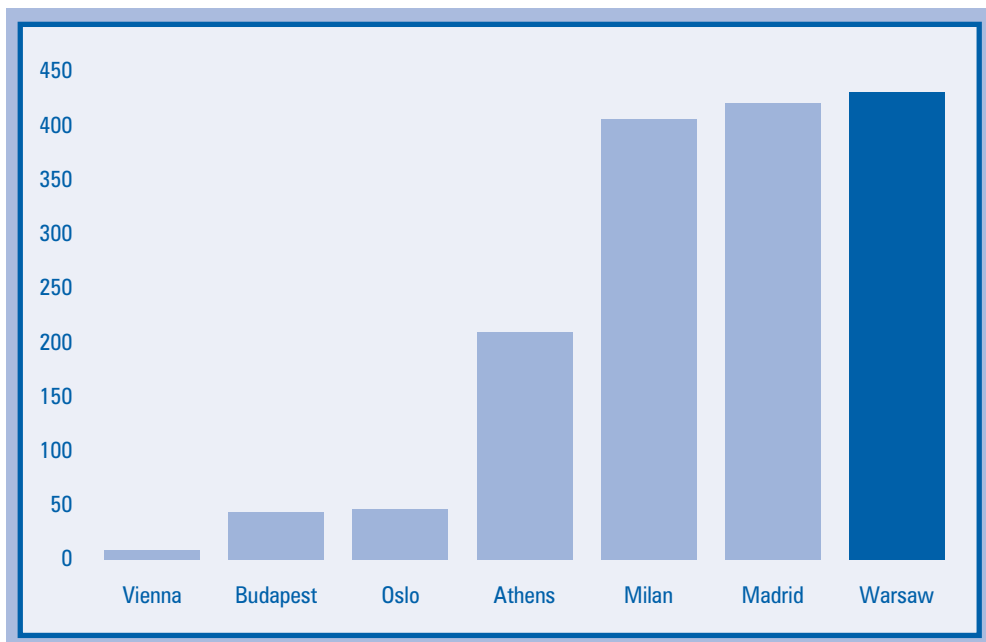
